SERMON QUESTIONS FOR SUNDAY, APRIL 18TH

- 1. What aspects of daily life can make you have doubts about your faith?
- 2. When has someone else stirred up doubts or fears in your mind, about your faith or about what was happening in the world.
- 3. What would provide definite proof about the resurrection for you?
- 4. Where have you seen evidence of our Lord's redemptive hand at work in the world in which you live?
- 5. When have you doubted you could do what Jesus is asking of you?
- 6. "What would Jesus do?" assumes Jesus is gone from the world. "What is Jesus doing?" assumes the risen Lord is still active within this world. Which perspective describes how you have viewed Jesus' role in your life now?

PRESBYTERIAN DISASTER ASSISTANCE (PDA): Works alongside communities as they recover and find hope after the devastation of natural or human-caused disasters, and support for refugees: Receives 32% of funds raised

PRESBYTERIAN HUNGER PROGRAM (PHP): Takes action to alleviate hunger, care for creation, and the systemic causes of poverty so all may be fed: Receives 36% of funds raised

SELF-DEVELOPMENT OF PEOPLE (SDOP): Invests in communities responding to their experiences of oppression, poverty and injustice and educates Presbyterians about the impact of these issues: Receives 32% of funds raised
