STEPS TO SIGN UP FOR VIRTUAL BLOOD DRIVE

- 1. After clicking on link, you will be taken to the Pledge page of the Vitalant website. Here, you are asked to state your intention to donate a life-saving blood product.
- 2. Click submit on lower right of page. You will now proceed to the Vitalant home page. Click 'Donate Now'.
- 3. Select the donor center that is convenient for you.
- 4. Select the type of donation: Whole blood, Double Red, Platelets, or Plasma.
- 5. Select your appointment date and time. Follow the instructions to schedule your appointment.

MOVING AHEAD TOGETHER IN-PERSON WORSHIP

I want to thank those who have been cooperating and patient with our new procedures in our re-opening for worship.

I thank people who have observed wise precautions and have gotten vaccinated. You've contributed to the new case rate decline that preceded our reopening. As a church, maintaining appropriate social distancing and appropriate mask wearing are still the most effective ways to do our part in maintaining the drop in COVID 19 new case rates. As individuals, taking the same precautions elsewhere and getting vaccinated if you have not done so will help maintain the drop in new case rates.

Your leadership is trying to keep up with the changes in recommended procedures and health guidelines Your help in this has already allowed us to make procedural changes. First, consistent with CDC guidelines for gatherings, we will allow people to sit with non-household members if all are vaccinated. We will trust your self-identification as vaccinated at the time you register.

The second change is that when Illuminate is outdoors, once people are seated in a socially distanced spot, vaccinated people may remove their masks when seated. They must wear masks while going to and from their seating area. Masks are to be worn at all times by those not yet vaccinated. Again, we will trust people's self-identification as vaccinated when they register.

Related to this is that in outdoor services people will be able to sing or join in prayers, etc. while wearing masks. Mask wearing while singing/speaking applies regardless of vaccination status.

A fourth change is that our upper limit has already been raised from 30 to 50 people for indoor services as social distancing permits.

Some have raised some questions about our reasoning for some procedures. One question was why we don't seat every other row as some other churches do. The answer is that the spacing between our pews mean that we do not meet the 6 foot distance guideline with every other pew spacing. Some have asked why we ask for preregistration. Jesus tells us to love our neighbor as ourselves. Being prepared to do contact tracing is one way we show love for our neighbors. Should, God forbid, we ever need to do contact tracing, the information we gather will greatly help that effort.

Having pre-registration also speeds up the check-in process because we only need ask information from those who didn't pre-register. We have been asked about our seating process. We ask people to cooperate with the process of being seated front to back and then leave from back to front. Our goal is to minimize people walking by each other and increasing exposure chances. We are assuming that attendees will be a mix of vaccinated and unvaccinated. Our process helps protect the more vulnerable, another sign of Christian love in action. If people prefer a seat, please let the usher know and then wait patiently in a socially distanced spot until an usher indicates it is an appropriate time.

Together we will live into the hope that our Lord presents us.
