Expressing Gratitude Together

Recalling the Gospel story of the four people who bring a paralyzed man to Jesus for healing by digging through the roof of the crowded house where Jesus was staying and lowering the man down on ropes, got me thinking about Stewardship here at FPC. The scripture reads, "When Jesus saw their faith, he said to the paralytic, "Son, your sins are forgiven" (Mark 2:5). Did it ever register that Jesus was talking about the faith of the four friends, not the faith of the paralyzed man who may or may not have initiated the encounter or may have just been along for the ride.

When Jesus witnessed this act of faith, he might have said, "With people like that around, we have something here!". When I looked around the sanctuary or the gym on Sunday mornings, I see volunteers outside to collect coats, or see the committed faces on the recent Zoom session meeting, or hear of the choir's plans, washing pans for soup kitchen meals being taken, see new (to me) faces at worship I have to agree! Some very exciting things are happening at First Pres especially considering the pandemic challenges,—with people like that around, we really do have something special here at FPC!

It makes me grateful to be part of the effort to share and express our faith in this place and time. Continuing to engage in ministry through a pandemic has taken positive and faithful hearts. For those who have such hearts, I am grateful.

A stewardship campaign also requires a great deal of faith and gratitude --not just from some of us, but from the whole group of us together. Our 2022 stewardship theme is "Expressing Gratitude Together." We have faith that if each of us, in gratitude for what God has given us, makes a commitment to sustain our church financially, the sum total of our pledges will be what we need to support our ministry in the coming year.
