"WALKING THE WAY OF THE CROSS with Paul"

6 week Lenten Study from Adult Education Hopefully combination in-person & ZOOM

Lent is, among other things, a journey on the way of the cross--a journey of learning how to appropriate Christ's teaching about "taking up the cross" (Mark 8:34-35) for ourselves. This six-session study will look at how one early Christian missionary, teacher, and theologian sought to do just that in his work and in his life.

Participants will examine a number of passages in Paul's letters in order to reflect on the place of the cross in Christian lives today. They will consider Paul's statements about the cross and its implications not only in themselves but in relation to his practice--including areas where he seems to us to have had difficulty living up to his own ideals.

The aim is to invite you into Lenten reflection and practice centered on the cross of Christ, guided by Paul's own incorporation of the cross into his spirituality. Leaders and participants will have an opportunity to reflect on their own practices of Christian spirituality and ethics in the light of the experience, teaching, and faith of the apostle Paul.

WEEK 1: What does it means to live in a new creation because of the crucified Messiah

WEEK 2: Rediscover/reclaim what is "foolish" about the Christian message and the Christian life, particularly w/ regard to the crucified Messiah. See 1 Cor 1:18–31

WEEK 3: Reflect on the relationship between Jesus and God. • Discuss our understanding about the place of Christ-like humility and obedience in our own lives

WEEK 4: Understand how Paul sees the cross of Christ as a means of spiritual transformation

WEEK 5: Learn Paul's understanding of the power of the cross. • Reflect on our own weakness and God's power in us.

WEEK 6: Articulate what the cross means for Christian living.

Emergency response to Ukraine war



As the violence in Ukraine continues, the number of people being displaced internally and fleeing to neighboring countries increases by the day. And in the midst of the chaos, there are sibling churches and ecumenical partners who are already providing assistance with basic items for survival. Our first priority is to provide funding to these partners on the ground. While the scale of this crisis is new, receiving refugees from Ukraine and other countries in Central and Eastern Europe is not, which means we have trusted, established partners with the knowledge and expertise to carry out this important work. Our response will include both financial and technical assistance as the network of faith communities providing humanitarian assistance grows in the months ahead.
