SESSION HIGHLIGHTS, MARCH 15TH, 2022

At their 3/15/22 meeting, Session opened with a time of reflection about healing patterns of discussion and looked at a Covenant of Behavioral Guidelines for future adoption. Session decided to:

- 1. Allow entrance for worship through the CE/office entrance, Bloomfield and Westville narthex doors and the Bloomfield Ave. door by the chapel. There would be a welcome table at both narthex entrances. Signs on the hallway doors by the chancel would ask people to go to the welcome tables.
- 2. Noted that a revised mission study has been sent to Presbytery's Committee on Ministry for approval.
- 3. Noted approval of an Audio/Video intern helper position in an e-vote between meetings to help with Sunday broadcasts at 9:30 and 11.
- 4. Approved a 20 hr./week Communications A/V staff to help with Sunday mornings, help preparation of materials for Sunday services, be available to help set-up weekday hybrid meetings.
- 5. Received the clerk's and financial reports.
- 6. The Revitalization and Reopening Committee presented adjustments in worship and activity guidelines that reduced the paperwork needed for event approval.
- 7. Received and approved all committee reports. Adult Ed highlighted the ongoing Lenten study. Building & Grounds mentioned potential projects that are being investigated. Communications Committee reported that the Caldwell-opoly games were now available for those who ordered them. Mission Committee said that Sandwich Night is slated to begin again in April. The Auction to support mission is scheduled for June 11.
- 8. Worship Committee is working on Holy Week plans.

SHARE YOUR VOICE TO SHAPE THE FUTURE

We continue to move forward to prepare for calling a new pastor, and your input and participation is very important to this work. You will recall we had worked with a Holy Cow! consultant to assist in getting ready and she has identified tasks that need to be done before we go further in calling a pastor. Two identified tasks were to share the wisdom we gained about better dealing with conflict than the church has done in the past and to explore our sense of why we are here in order to discern a mission vision statement. A Mission Statement answers the question, "Why do we do what we do as the body of Christ here at FPC?" Addressing these tasks is necessary to both attract a new pastor and assist them in leading us into a more vibrant future.

As follower's of Christ, knowing why we exist and what we are committed to helps us make consistent decisions about what to do and how we do it. This unites members in their sense of purpose in all of their ministries as well as helping to reduce disagreements when the what and how parts get elevated to exaggerated importance. The power of such an understanding holds us accountable in our relationships with God and with each other.

Our Planning Team is asking you to be available for our next meeting on April 9 from 9am-12 noon. We will meet around tables in Fellowship Hall and by Zoom so we can accommodate as many as possible. At that meeting we will look at the strengths and discard lists from the first meeting and ask what values can be seen in those lists. This will be a foundation for listing core values of the church that will guide the way we enact a mission vision. Core values seen with added scripture study will help us frame our provisional mission statement.

A mission statement created as a community effort, including input from many within the congregation creates an opportunity for all of us to unite in our discernment of our "Why" and take ownership of It. This first step helps us to re-member who FPC can be as the body of Christ in the world.

Emergency response to Ukraine war



As the violence in Ukraine continues, the number of people being displaced internally and fleeing to neighboring countries increases by the day. And in the midst of the chaos, there are sibling churches and ecumenical partners who are already providing assistance with basic items for survival. Our first priority is to provide funding to these partners on the ground. While the scale of this crisis is new, receiving refugees from Ukraine and other countries in Central and Eastern Europe is not, which means we have trusted, established partners with the knowledge and expertise to carry out this important work. Our response will include both financial and technical assistance as the network of faith communities providing humanitarian assistance grows in the months ahead.

May we all, even as we breathe in lament, breathe out mercy, hope and peace. And in this Lenten season, when we walk the way toward death and resurrection, repent our complicity in cultures of violence and renew our efforts toward justice and peace.
