

One of the wonderful blessings at FPC is the Bell Choir. They have been actively rehearsing and will be continuing to rehearse each Thursday evening. I look forward to working with them. They will be playing once a month in Sunday Worship; and of course, will be participating on Christmas Eve. In addition to their solo pieces, I look forward to having them participate in hymns on the Sundays they are playing for us.

I have had the honor to lead some outstanding music ministries in New York City and New Jersey. As Director of Music my focus was to build and direct the choirs of the church and fill the role of primary organist and pianist.
