The First Presbyterian Church at Caldwell's Facing Racism Task Force invites you to a fall/winter book study of a new book, co-authored by West Orange, NJ resident, Kerry Connelly. Published in 2022, Wait – Is This Racist? A Guide to Becoming an Anti-Racist Church has already gotten positive reviews. Pastor and author Robert W. Lee described the book as this: "...You have before you a guidebook, a survival guide, a deconstruction chisel, and a faithful interpretation of the reign of God that is at hand. This book made me think critically about my own blind spots while also acknowledging the potential areas of growth that could happen in my personal and professional life. ... You would be wise to sit with this book—it will change you."

Connelly's co-authors of the book are Bryana Clover and Josh Riddick.

The Facing Racism Task Force will be able to provide the book to you free of charge. This study will meet via Zoom for five Thursdays on the following dates: Oct. 27, Nov. 17, Dec. 8, Jan. 12 & Jan. 26. Meeting times will be from 7:30 pm – 8:45 pm.

## **Session Highlights**

The FPC Session met on September 20, 2022 and opened with prayer at 7 pm.

Session received the Clerk's report which included highlights of the September 17 meeting of the Presbytery of Northeast New Jersey. Among the Presbytery actions was acknowledging Barbara Piercy's status as honorably retired.

Session took the following actions:

- On motion from the Children and Youth Ministry committee, approved the creation of a paid Cradle Room attendant for Sunday mornings, 9 am-1 pm at \$15/hour. There have been too few volunteers to guarantee weekly staffing.
- Endorsed Bonnie Chiappetta as an Inquirer for Ministry. That's the PCUSA's first official step in the process for ordination to be a Minister of Word and Sacrament.
- Approved the Reopening and Revitalization Committee's motion to end requirements for the filing of Covid precaution forms for church events, and to consider disbanding the RRC after Easter.
- Approved exploring with Congregation Agudath Israel having a table at upcoming Caldwell University student welcome events.
- Agreed that Session would sponsor Sandwich night on October 26. Lydia Spinelli will determine costs and collect money from session members.

Session received the minutes and reports of its committees and approved the plans in the reports:

- Adult Education shared their newsletter which contains links for the fall book study, links to devotional sites for personal use, book reviews and links to other study material.
- Building & Grounds reported on completed projects. Including repair and repainting of the sanctuary dormer window frames and repairs of water damage at the Bloomfield Ave. entrance near the chapel.
- Building Grounds, Mission Committee and Deacons are cooperating on a dedication of the renovated chapel, tentatively October 23.
- Children & Youth Ministry reported on the start of the Church school year. Planning has started for Confirmation class this year.
- Communications Committee reported on plans for the Oct. 2 Caldwell Street Fair and asked for volunteers.
- Mission Committee reported on plans for the African Dream Academy Red Bag collection Sept. 25-October 23, the currently running Urban Promise Book Drive, the Giving Tree program starting Nov. 1, the Facing Racism Task Force book study on "Wait - Is This Racist," which will begin October 27.
- Personnel Committee was happy too share that Valerie Shondel has been hired as the Interim Music Director, and that we have 2 AV interns now help the Sunday morning service broadcasts.
- The Stewardship Committee reported on starting an "Expressing Our Gratitude" announcement and sharing time to encourage people to think about their support of the church and to celebrate things we are doing as a church.
- Worship Committee shared minutes and reported helping organize the Piercy farewell, and supporting the work of the Music Vision/Search team People were encouraged to do the Music survey if they haven't already.
