*Dear Friends in Faith,*

*As we prepare to welcome Pastor William Schram to First Presbyterian Church at Caldwell, we would like to share some personal information, which he provided to our Committee:*

**My journey to ministry reads like Jonah's – I ran from it for a while. My father was a Presbyterian pastor and I grew up with people asking if I was going to be a pastor like him. After college I served in a City/County Ombudsman's office. Helping people in complaints against bureaucracy felt fulfilling. I also got involved in a local church where I was drafted to help with the youth group. I soon found that it was the Gospel that added meaning to my weekly work and renewed my spirit after dealing with complaints. My teaching with the youth group drew positive response from students and other teachers. I made the decision to go to seminary realizing that I wasn't going to be a minister exactly like my father any more than he could be one exactly like me. And that's how God liked it. With that realization, it became a joy to talk ministry with Dad.**


**I attended McCormick Seminary in Chicago. I met my wife Jenny there. We got married just before the start of our senior year at seminary. From there we went to a co-pastor position, each ½ time, at a redevelopment church in Detroit Presbytery. After a few years, we realized that: we each needed to grow in ministry beyond what we did ½ time and do so without stepping on the other's areas of responsibilities. I went full time at the church and Jenny did some part-time interim work then became the stated clerk of the Presbytery.**

**I have served churches, in seminary and since, in urban, center city, near suburb, small town, and county seat town settings. I have served as pastor, associate pastor, interim pastor, and have served as a chaplain at a hospital. I find worship leadership, pastoral care, teaching, mission support and visioning all to be rewarding aspects of ministry.**

**In Detroit, Lehigh and Albany Presbyteries I have been on the Committee on Ministry. I served on the Committee on Preparation for Ministry in Detroit and Scioto Valley Presbyteries. I have completed interim training and was trained as a consultant for the visioning process that Lehigh Presbytery provided for congregations in partnership with the Center for Parish Development. My work in Albany resulted in my connecting with the Ghana Mission Network of the PC(USA), increasing my knowledge of and experience with mission partners in Ghana.**

Between work times, I enjoy the outdoors while humming the songs that I know at least the first verse of. My musical tastes are varied from the popular music of my younger days, to hymns, to contemporary Christian songs and to jazz. After being told by my doctor to go on a heart healthy diet, I have gotten interested in cooking and figuring out how to make food taste interesting without salt.

We have two natural and one foster daughter. Delightfully, we also have a granddaughter to enjoy.
