Jr. High Pittsburgh Project (Incoming 7th-9th graders)

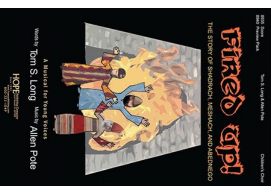
**July 20th—July 27th:**

Performance time is 35 minutes.



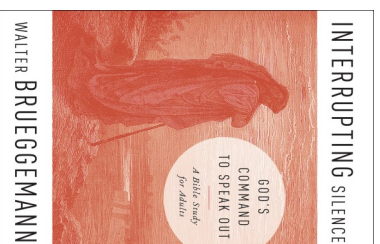
## NEW OFFERING ENVELOPES

## TUESDAY TALKS—LENT

Our Lenten Tuesday Talks will begin on **Tuesday, March 12th through Tuesday, April 9th at 11:00AM in the Parlor**. The book we will study is *Interrupting Silence* by Walter Brueggemann. Silence is a complex matter. It can refer to awe before unutterable holiness, but it can also refer to the coercion where some voices are silenced in the interest of control by the dominant voices. It is the latter silence that Walter Brueggemann explores, urging us to speak up in situations of injustice.

*Interrupting Silence* illustrates that the Bible is filled with stories where marginalized people break repressive silence and speak against it. Examining how maintaining silence allows the powerful to keep control, Brueggemann motivates readers to consider situations in their lives where they need to either interrupt silence or be part of the problem, convincing us that God is active and wanting us to act for justice.

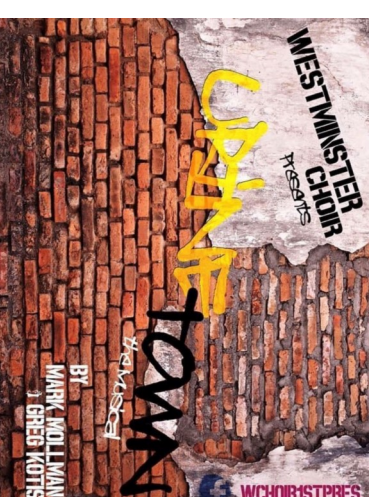
