WHEN GOD'S SPIRIT MOVES

New Spring ZOOM Study from Adult Education **6 Wednesday Evenings – April 14th to May 19th 7:00 to 8:30 PM**

QUESTION: If you had to explain the **Holy Spirit** to a 10 year old and what He does, how would you go about it? What words would you use? What examples would you give to describe this 3rd member of the Trinity?

JESUS: "I will ask the Father, and he will give you another advocate to help you and be with you forever – the **Spirit of truth**. The world cannot accept him because it neither sees him nor knows him. But you know him, for he lives with you and will be in you." (John 14:16-17)

A Timely Study for Us All

A great many of us probably do not think a lot about the Holy Spirit or know how to best describe him, even though we are familiar with this critical passage of Jesus' announcement of our "advocate". After his resurrection but before his ascension, Jesus again tells us. "You will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and you will be my witnesses ... to the ends of the earth." (Acts 1:8) And after his final ascension into Heaven, the Spirit came to earth on that day in Pentecost and lives in each soul who accepts Christ Jesus as our Redeemer.

Please join us as we head toward Pentecost, and get reacquainted with our "Advocate", "Helper", "Counselor" and "Comforter". Be encouraged through the testimonies of people whose encounters with the Spirit empowered both their physical and spiritual lives. Let's see what restoration can happen when the Holy Spirit moves powerfully within a church.

SELF-DEVELOPMENT OF PEOPLE (SDOP): Invests in communities responding to their experiences of oppression, poverty and injustice and educates Presbyterians about the impact of these issues: Receives 32% of funds raised
